R. Jerry Cole

(East Central, Epsilon Omega '63)

Jerry Cole entered Chapter Eternal on February 19, 2006. He had served Epsilon Omega as vice president before his graduation from East Central University in Ada, Oklahoma, in 1966. Jerry was the "Pledge Class of One" that helped the men of Tau Sigma Tau, a local fraternity, become a colony of Pi Kappa Alpha, and then the Epsilon Omega Chapter. Others, individually and collectively, may think that they were the cornerstone of Epsilon Omega, but the true cornerstone of the chapter was Jerry Cole. His uncle was Joe C. Scott (*Oklahoma State, Gamma Chi '39*), National President of Pi Kappa Alpha when Jerry was an undergraduate at East Central. When the local, Tau Sigma Tau, decided to pledge Jerry as the "Class of One" in the spring of 1963, it was Jerry's connection to Pi Kappa Alpha that created the opportunity for our local to become a colony of Pi Kappa Alpha.

Jerry was always laughing and smiling. He greeted his brothers in class, in the SUB, and even in chapter meetings with the famous Cole smile and laugh. His smiling face even appears in our petition to Pi Kappa Alpha at the head of the pledge class.

After college, when we encountered Jerry at the horse races in Ruidoso, New Mexico, or at the airport in San Antonio,

Texas, he still greeted us with that million dollar smile, and before the conversation had ended, his infectious laughter once again had brightened the day. John Donne was right, "no man is an island". We are all somehow or other connected, and at times like these, when we learn of the death of one of the true stalwarts of our chapter, we realize our lives have been diminished.

Jerry was predeceased by his first wife, Martha "Punkin" Testerman, and is survived by his second wife, Peggy Lipke Cole. In addition to his wife, he is survived by two sons and two stepdaughters as well as one grandson and five step-grandchildren. Contributions in honor of Jerry may be sent to Camp Sweeney, P.O. Stephen J. Perrello, Jr.

(Cornell, Beta Theta '65)

On March 14, 2006, Stephen J. Perrello entered Chapter Eternal after a valiant battle with brain cancer.

Perrello earned his B.A. in French from Cornell University, his J.D. from the University of Buffalo School of Law, and his Ph.D. in Criminal Justice at Rutgers University. A member of the San Diego County Bar Association, he was also invited into the Criminal Defense Lawyers Club, and had a busy legal career. Perrello was the primary force behind a landmark decision that recognized the civil rights of parolees. In addition, he participated in a case that successfully invalidated a sales tax aimed at generating revenues to build more jails. In recent years, he focused on scholarship and teaching, and will be missed by colleagues and students at Alliant University.

He enjoyed ballet, classical music, good food, swimming with the "Different Strokes" club, as well as deep philosophical discussions with colleagues and friends. Friends of Stephen J. Charlton S. Roby

(Millsaps, Alpha Iota '39)

Charlton S. Roby entered Chapter Eternal on February 1, 2006 in Jackson,



Mississippi. During World War II, Roby served as a lieutenant in the U.S. Coast Guard Reserves, assigned to the USS Cambria in the Pacific theater. In later life, he served Millsaps College on the board of the Gen. Louis Wilson Fund. His brother, Victor Roby, retired broadcast announcer for NBC, was a 1935 initiate of Alpha Iota.

Another Alpha Iota brother, Mark B. Eppes '73, wrote this memory of Charlton Roby:

"Mr. Roby would tell you that his primary influence and inspiration for college (in particular Millsaps College) and the Fraternity was Harvey T. Newell, Jr., the former National President of PiKA and Mr. Roby's high school teacher. After the sudden death of Roby's father in Tylertown, Mississippi, just prior to WWII, the Roby family was encouraged by Mr. Newell to move to Jackson, where Mrs. Roby was able to find employment and a place for the family to live just blocks from Millsaps College. If I recall correctly, in later years, Mr. Roby was to discover that Brother Newell had actually made provision in his will for the college education of both of the Roby 'boys'. With the death of Harvey T. Newell, while in service to the Fraternity, Mr. Roby made an effort to always encourage the recognition and appreciation of Harvey T. Newell by Alpha Iota Chapter."

Eric William Rodriguez, 22, of Mesa Grande, Arizona, entered Chapter Eternal on February 26, 2006. He was a loyal member of Theta Rho Chapter at Northern Arizona University.

Chad J. Steward

(Tulsa, Gamma Upsilon '36)

Chad Steward entered Chapter Eternal on April 25, 2006, at the age of 89. He earned his bachelor's degree in English and his master's degree in business communication from the University of Tulsa, where he was the first president of Gamma Upsilon Chapter of Pi Kappa Alpha. He served as a cryptographer in the U.S. Army during World War II. Afterwards, he headed the advertising department at Dowell Division of the Dow Chemical

Company, and was the executive vice president of Runkle-Moroch, Inc. He was one of the founders and presidents of the Business Professional Advertising Association, and first recipient of their Golden Ring Award. Steward also received the distinguished Silver Addy from the Tulsa Advertising Federation. He served on the University of Tulsa Alumni Board and Tulsa Communications Forum Board, among many civic activities. He was a member of St. Luke's Episcopal Church and served as a senior warden and vestry member. He is survived by his wife, Anita, five children and 12 grandchildren.

Joseph M. Winder

(Utah, Alpha Tau '26)

Joseph M. Winder entered Chapter Eternal at his home in Salt Lake City on February 11, 2006. After graduating from the University of Utah, where he was editor of the yearbook, Winder served an LDS mission to South Carolina before



attending Harvard University where he completed an MBA in 1933. Seeing Babe Ruth play at the old Fenway Park was one of his favorite remembrances of this time in Boston. He married Cleone Williams in 1937 and in 1939 joined two of his brothers in developing the business of State Farm Insurance in Utah. Winder retired as agency manager at the age of 70 but continued to work until the age of 93. He loved sports and had University of Utah season tickets for over 60 years. He became a member of the Salt Lake Country Club in 1952 where he continued to play golf up until the last six months of his life. Winder is survived by his three sons, David, Donald, and Steven; six grandchildren and one great grandchild.
