



# 2008 INTERNATIONAL WORK DAY

- 83 chapters participated
- 415 individual projects were completed
- \$254,830 in housing improvements were made
- Over 3,565 alumni, undergraduate members, parents and guests participated

International Work Day, supported by the International Fraternity's Real Estate Department, is a day-long event set by the chapter or house corporation, dedicated to renovation and house improvement projects. Every chapter who participated in the 2008 International Work Day received a \$150 grant, recognition plaque, and a four foot tall wall appliqué of the Fraternity's badge. Each award winner received a plaque and a \$100 gift certificate to a local hardware store. The Overall Work Day winner took home a trophy as well as a \$500 grant for additional improvements to their facility.

Since International Work Day was founded, 3,826 improvement projects have been completed at a total cost of \$2,290,826. These events included the involvement of 32,577 alumni, students, parents, and friends. While a considerable amount of valuable work has been completed for the betterment of Pike houses everywhere, a number of house corporation boards have been created and/or enhanced in conjunction with the Work Day endeavors.
