### From the President of the Educational Foundation

Dear Brothers and Friends of Pi Kappa Alpha:

By any measure you might choose, 2007 was a remarkable year for the Pi Kappa Alpha Educational Foundation.

4,400 alumni brothers and friends made cash, security, or other gifts to the Foundation.

Total annual giving to the Foundation increased by over 20% versus 2006.

- 2,100 *undergraduate* brothers also contributed to the Foundation.
- In fact, in 28 of our undergraduate chapters, 100% of the members were also donors to the Foundation.
- We finished the year with 272 members of the President's Council – the most in our history – quietly and generously underwriting the operations of the Foundation.
- 150 brothers are now members of the Oak Trust, also the most in our history, and with the current value of planned gifts now well exceeding \$10 million.
- Recently we have experienced more than our share of sadness, as some of our most loyal brothers, engaged for literally their entire adult lives in the work of Pi Kappa Alpha, passed to the Chapter Eternal. Among the many we will miss, and for whose lives we will always be grateful are Trustee Emeriti Garth Grissom and Tom Wade, and Foundation Trustee and Past International President Mark Anderson. They inspire us still.

We take great satisfaction in the accomplishments of 2007, more fully recounted in the annual report which follows. More importantly, our financial success makes it possible to fund the Fraternity's programs which support character development, leadership, and service. We do it in the personal setting of the chapter, where some of the most important gifts of our lives unfold. No one else on campus does what we do – and we do what every undergraduate needs if he is to develop into a responsible citizen of exemplary character. The Pi Kappa Alpha Educational Foundation is a vital partner in our Fraternity's advance to the forefront of the fraternity movement, as we build character in the construct of lifelong friendship.

- Assisting in establishing, equipping and maintaining libraries, study rooms or other educational facilities within college student housing facilities.
- Preserving books, archives, war records, works of art and related objects for the encouragement of patriotic and historical research, particularly research into the history of education.
- Maintaining a permanent memorial for members of the Pi Kappa Alpha Fraternity who gave their lives in military service to the United States, Canada and their allies.

## Five Outstanding Alumni Inducted Into Order of West Range



Five distinguished gentlemen were inducted into the Order of West Range at the 2008 International Convention. Founded in 1986, the Order of West Range recognizes those Pi Kappa Alpha alumnus members who have gained distinction through career accomplishments, service to society and/or service to the Fraternity.

Each recipient gave candid remarks about his own unique experience with Pi Kappa Alpha. One resounding theme was that despite having different backgrounds, in addition to attending different colleges or universities, they would not be the same men they are today without Pi Kappa Alpha.

First to receive the award was Brother Holland, President and CEO of Unity Hunt, Inc. in Dallas, Texas. He urged the audience to always be determined in your endeavors, set goals and take risks. Second was Robert Certain, who remarked on his unique experience as a prisoner of war in Vietnam. He noted how Pike has been a constant part of his life and how he was able to make the transition from POW to minister.

Next to receive the honor was James Thomas, who urged everyone to empower others to achieve their best. Brother Thomas will forever be remembered for engaging the audience to help him in cheering on a fellow chapter brother and his family through his video camera.

To follow, Jamie Wolff commented on what has turned out to be a consistent love affair with Pi Kappa Alpha. He shared that throughout his many years with the Fraternity, many small experiences have reaffirmed why he became a Pike. The final recipient, Andrew Coats, was able to captivate the audience through his humorous story telling. By sharing the importance of avoiding poor preparation, he explained that everyone can be successful.

## Robertson Most Outstanding Undergraduate Award

**Joe O'Shea (Florida State, Delta Lambda '04) Recognized As 2008 Recipient**

During the 2008 International Convention, the Pi Kappa Alpha Educational Foundation recognized **Joe O'Shea** (Florida State, Delta Lambda '04) as the recipient of the 2008 Robertson Most Outstanding Undergraduate Award. This prestigious award is given annually to the Fraternity's most outstanding graduating senior who is chosen from a pool of very accomplished and successful undergraduate members.

O'Shea graduated from Florida State University in 2008, earning a degree in Philosophy while carrying a perfect 4.0 GPA. While a student at Florida State, O'Shea built a strong resume that included the following awards and activities:

- 2008 Rhodes Scholar
- Phi Beta Kappa Honor Society
- Garnet and Gold Key

Because of his work on the Florida State campus, in 2007, O'Shea was elected student body president. He won the office with an unprecedented 71 percent of the vote. During his tenure as SGA president, O'Shea oversaw a budget of \$10 million and was instrumental in the construction of a new health and wellness center on campus.

Two of O'Shea's biggest concerns are inadequate healthcare and social injustice. It should come as no surprise then that the hallmark of O'Shea's undergraduate days was his service to others in these very areas. He has been active in many state and community efforts in Florida and started a free health clinic in the Katrina-ravaged Ninth Ward of New Orleans. Michelle Shin, Director of Common Ground's Lower Ninth Ward Project stated, "I've seen young volunteers come to the Ninth Ward with lofty dreams

of rebuilding the city after Katrina. But, I've never met one like Joe O'Shea."

In 2008, O'Shea was selected as a Rhodes Scholar, which is awarded internationally to fund an academic degree at Oxford University in England and will be enrolling in that program this fall. O'Shea stated that: "Over the next few years I will head to Oxford for a doctorate in social policy on the Rhodes Scholarship. I have dedicated my life to public service and to creating greater opportunities for others to flourish."

In describing the impact Pi Kappa Alpha has on his life and the value that it continues

to bring to him today, Brother O'Shea commented, "Throughout all of my college years, I could not have asked for a better group of guys to surround myself with, a group who challenged, supported, and cared for me through my entire college experience."

Educational Foundation Trustee Tom Tillar (Virginia Tech, Epsilon '71) and Endowment Fund Commissioner Tom Clark (Virginia Tech, Epsilon '73) presented this year's award to Brother O'Shea. Before presenting the award, Tillar and Clark spoke about the dedication and respect they each had for the Robertson Award's namesake, Jenks Robertson (Clemson, Eta Alpha '71). Robertson, a long time advisor to Epsilon Chapter, was killed by a drunk driver in 1986 while walking to the Epsilon Chapter house. Tillar and Clark spoke of the great affinity held by members of Epsilon Chapter and their pride that his legacy lives on through this coveted award.

Brother O'Shea received a \$2,500 scholarship and plaque, funded through the Robertson Award endowment at the Pi Kappa Alpha Educational Foundation.

The Pi Kappa Alpha Educational Foundation also congratulates the four other finalists for the Robertson Award for their exemplary accomplishments as student members of Pi Kappa Alpha. 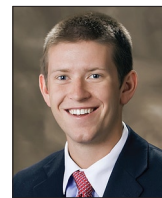

Over the past year, 2,100 students supported the Pi Kappa Alpha Educational Foundation with gifts totaling \$41,475. Having given \$25 or more, these individuals are members of the Pi Kappa Alpha Educational Foundation's Phi Phi Kappa Alpha Club. This year, undergraduates set a record for 100% Chapter participation with 28 chapters joining at the 100% level.
